**„Crisis in Urban Order“**

International Commission for the History of Towns—2022 Conference

Maynooth, Dublin, Derry (Ireland/UK)

13–16 September 2022

Addressing the overall theme of *Urban Order*, the ICHT 2022 programme will take a comparative historical and geographical approach to explore *Crisis in Urban Order*. The themes will encompass a range of crises and their spatial, cultural and material impacts and manifestations on the towns and cities of Europe but with a particular focus on the island of Ireland. 2022 marks the centenary of the Partition of Ireland, and the creation of a border on the island between ‘north’ and ‘south’ that has had profound implications for urban order, with legacies still today for cities across Ireland. Papers will address ‘crisis’ over the medieval, early modern and modern periods precipitated by natural catastrophes such as disease and environmental change, war and religious and political conflicts, population migrations and movements. The programme will span the island of Ireland, between ‘north’ and ‘south’, by being based in two locations, Dublin/Maynooth and Derry/Londonderry. It builds on an existing collaboration between the Irish Historic Towns Atlas and the British Historic Towns Atlas programmes and, in the spirit of connecting Ireland north and south in our centenary year, it is jointly convened by Dublin City University, Maynooth University, the Royal Irish Academy and Queen’s University Belfast, with support from Derry City Council.

The programme explores three manifestations of ‘crisis’ in urban order—1. Conflict and the city—impacts of war, insurrection, protest, riots; 2. Pestilence and plague—impacts of disease, climate, sanitation, supplies; 3. Religions and crisis—impacts of dissent, reformations, factionalism, heresy. The conference papers are international and range across the medieval, early modern and modern eras, encouraging comparative study, as well as enabling geographical comparisons across Europe. Topics covered by the papers include 1. Spatial order of the urban landscape; 2. Political order of urban governance; 3. Social order of population and people. Papers offer case studies of countries, regions and cities, exploring a range of spatial scales of ‘crisis in urban order’.

The programme convenors are Michael Potterton (Maynooth University), Ruth McManus (Dublin City University), Sarah Gearty (Royal Irish Academy) and Keith Lilley (Queen’s University Belfast).

**Maps as original sources. Town plans and their impact on the knowledge of the urban past**

Conference Report by Laurentiu Răduan

On May 5-6, 2022, the conference "*Maps as original sources. Town plans and their impact on the knowledge of the urban past*" took place in Iasi, Romania. Organized within a project dedicated to the identification of new cartographic sources, led by prof. Laurențiu Răduan, the purpose of the conference was to emphasize the importance of historical city plans for historical research and beyond.

Town plans may contain hints about the emergence of towns, how they were organized, streets, neighborhoods, fortifications, major and minor structures, churches and houses, topography and local hydrography, public works, economic facilities and many more. Recent decades have seen an increase in the literature about towns based on historical plans already known, and what was to be discovered in the archives seemed to have already been discovered. However, as new town plans in the Romanian area have been recently located in the archives of Vienna and especially of Moscow, we were granted the opportunity of a return to origins and to a specific question: what new information can old town maps offer? The conference organized in Iasi in May 2022 offered interested specialists the occasion to present the results of recent researches that bring into the spotlight the plans of cities, either known or unknown.

During the conference, papers were presented on various topics, from vedutas of cities from the 16th-17th centuries to urban plans from the Second World War, from Poland to the Republic of Moldova. ### Nachruf Ursula Braasch-Schwermann (1955–2021)

Am 17. Dezember 2021 ist Ursula Braasch-Schwermann nach schwerer Krankheit verstorben. Geboren wurde sie im schleswig-holsteinischen Eutin am 2. Sept. 1955 – also im Jahr der Gründung der Internationalen Kommission für Städtegeschichte (ICHT/CIHV) – und wuchs in Neumünster auf. Ihr Lehramtsstudium der Romanischen Philologie, Geschichte und Sozialkunde nahm sie im Wintersemester 1974/75 an der Philipps-Universität Marburg auf. Dem Ort wie der Universität blieb sie zeitlebens verbunden. Unter ihrem akademischen Lehrer Prof. Dr. Fred Schwind (1929–2004) erhielt sie 1979 eine erste Anstellung als studentische Hilfskraft im Hessischen Landesamt für geschichtliche Landeskunde. 1980 wurde sie als wissenschaftliche Mitarbeiterin in dem Ausstellungsprojekt anlässlich des 750. Todestages der Heiligen Elisabeth von Thüringen beschäftigt. In den nächsten Jahren war sie an unterschiedlichen Projekten des Hessischen Landesamtes beteiligt, beispielsweise an der Fertigstellung des Geschichtlichen Atlas von Hessen. 1988 wurde sie im Fachbereich Geschichtswissenschaften mit einer Arbeit über das Marburger Deutschordenshaus im Spätmittelalter promoviert. Die Geschichte der geistlichen Ritterorden, insbesondere des Deutschen Ordens und der Heiligen Elisabeth beschäftigten sie bis in ihre letzten Jahre. Als Nachfolgerin von Fred Schwind übernahm sie 1995 die Leitung Hessischen Landesamtes für geschichtliche Landeskunde.

Unter ihrer Leitung trat das Landesamt auch dem Kreis der europäischen Städteatlasproduzenten bei. Als Mitglied der ICHT/CIHV entwickelte sie die Richtlinien, etwa bezüglich Kartenanon und Farbgebung, mit. 2005 wurde im Hessischen Ministerium für Wissenschaft und Kunst in Wiesbaden schließlich die 1. Lieferung des Hessischen Städteatlas präsentiert. Neben dem Städteatlas förderte sie zudem das Historische Ortslexikon und betrieb in Zusammenarbeit mit Kolleg:innen die Herausgabe des Hessischen Jahrbuchs für Landesgeschichte und der beiden Schriftenreihen des Landesamtes. Ab den 2000er Jahren begann am Landesamt zudem der Aufbau eines digitalen Fachinformationssystems. In Kooperation mit dem Hochschulrechenzentrum der Universität wurde das „Landesgeschichtliche Informationssystem Hessen“ (LAGIS) entwickelt, das unter den landeskundlich-landesgeschichtlichen Informationssystemen im deutschsprachigen Raum mittlerweile eine führende Rolle spielt. Gegen Ende ihrer Amtszeit wurde ein unter dem Oberbegriff „HLGL Maps“ firmierender web-basierter Kartendienst initiiert. Seit 1993 nahm Ursula Braasch-Schwermann Lehraufträge an der Philipps-Universität Marburg wahr und 2000 erfolgte die Verleihung einer Honorarprofessur.

Ihre wissenschaftlichen Interessen und beruflichen Tätigkeiten schlügen sich auch in zahlreichen Kommissions- und Beiratsmitgliedschaften nieder. Als Beispiele seien genannt: der Arbeitskreis für Historische Kartographie in der Arbeitsgemeinschaft der Historischen Kommissionen und landesgeschichtlichen Institute (seit 1984); das Kuratorium für vergleichende Städtegeschichte, Münster (seit 1993, Sprecherin des Beirats seit 1999); die Historischen Kommissionen für Hessen (seit 1994), Nassau (seit 1994), Darmstadt (seit 1995) und Thürin-

gen (seit 1997); der Beirat für geschichtliche Landeskunde am Hessischen Ministerium für Wissenschaft und Kunst (Mitglied und 2. Vorsitzende seit 2001); der Landesdenkmalrat in Hessen (seit 2001); die Internationale Kommission für Städtegeschichte (ICHT/CIHV, seit 2008) und die Internationale Kommission zur Erforschung des Deutschen Ordens (seit 2010). Bereits schwer erkrankt, konnte ihr im Oktober 2020 – pandemiebedingt – im kleinsten Kreis eine Festschrift zu ihrem 65. Geburtstag überreicht werden, an der sich auch einige Mitglieder der ICHT/CIHV beteiligt hatten. Im Dezember 2020 verlieh ihr Staatsministerin Angela Dorn die Goethe-Plakette, die höchste Auszeichnung, die das Hessische Ministerium für Wissenschaft und Kunst vergibt.

Wir werden Ursula Braasch-Schwersmann als stets freundliche und gesprächsbereite Kollegin in Erinnerung behalten, deren Beteiligung und Präsenz besonders an den Tagungen und Veranstaltungen der ICHT/CIHV sowie des Instituts für Vergleichende Städtegeschichte fehlen wird.

In memoriam **Claire Dickstein-Bernard** (1933-2020)

Claire Dickstein-Bernard (\* Etterbeek/Bruxelles 1933) est décédée inopinément à Auderghem/Bruxelles le 22 mai 2020. Présentée comme membre effectif représentant la Belgique par Mina Martens, archiviste de la Ville de Bruxelles qui siégeait au sein de notre Commission depuis sa création, elle en fut la secrétaire générale durant une dizaine d'années (1981-1990), sous la présidence du prof. Sergij Vilfan. C'est alors que furent édités les premiers numéros des *Nouvelles de la Commission* (n° 1, Trèves 1983)<sup>1</sup>. Claire Dickstein-Bernard perdit par la suite tout lien avec notre Commission.

Licenciée en Histoire de l'Université de Bruxelles en 1955 (son mémoire, dirigé par le prof. Paul Bonenfant, était consacré à la famille des Régnier, à l'origine des premiers comtes de Hainaut et de Louvain), elle fut engagée aux Archives de la Ville de Bruxelles en 1958. Sous l'impulsion de Mina Martens, qui marqua fortement sa carrière, elle concentra dès lors ses recherches sur l'histoire de la capitale et notamment sur la gestion des finances d'une grande ville au bas Moyen Âge, thème d'ailleurs de sa thèse de doctorat défendue à l'Université libre de Bruxelles en 1974. Par de nombreux articles, elle étudia notamment les rapports entre la Ville et les ducs de Bourgogne, en particulier Philippe le Bon : elle ne verra pas paraître son ultime ouvrage sous presse consacré à l'*Aula magna* du palais du Coudenberg à Bruxelles auquel elle tenait beaucoup. Mais elle eut bien d'autres fers au feu : les métiers et corporations, la construction de l'hôtel de ville notamment retinrent son attention.

Sa nomination en tant qu'archiviste de la Commission de l'Assistance (aujourd'hui Centre public d'action sociale de la Ville de Bruxelles) en 1975 lui confia le plus riche dépôt d'archives médiévales de Bruxelles, celles des hôpitaux et confréries charitables. Cette mission élargit son champ d'investigation à l'histoire hospitalière jusqu'à la période contemporaine. Mais à sa retraite en 1976, c'est vers l'histoire médiévale qu'elle revint.

Claire Dickstein-Bernard fut associée à toutes les synthèses de l'histoire de Bruxelles parues depuis 1976.

De son propre aveu, les rencontres et les relations nouées au sein de notre Commission ont enrichi sa recherche.
