Mapping Crisis – Historic Towns Atlases and Divided Cities – Atlas Working Group Meeting

Friday 16 September 2022, 12.00-13.00

1. Welcome / apologies / new members

- Several colleagues participated remotely via the impromptu Zoom meeting. Michał Słomski (POL), Melanie Müller-Bering (GER), Niklas Alt (GER)

2. Minutes of AWG 2021 (circulated)/matters arising

- Minutes accepted and agreed as a record of 2021 AWG meeting.
- No matters arising.

3. The session of the Atlas Working Group focused on the possibility of using the Historic Towns Atlas series for comparative research on the problem of a divided cities. Presentations were made by:

Anna Maleszka and Roman Czaja presented the specificities of divided Prussian cities, Judit Majorossy - of Hungarian cities, Rosa Smurra - of Italian cities, Martin Uhrmacher - of Luxembourg cities and Raymond Gillespie - of Irish cities.

4. Presentation of new HTAs

- Progress in producing print HTAs was presented by teams from Poland (three new volumes), Ireland (regular and Dublin Suburbs series), Britain (Oxford), Germany (national and Westphalian), Hungary (Pécs, Óbuda)
- Maps on Ljubljana from the new series Historical Atlas of Slovenian Cities were presented by Miha Kosi
- The Luxembourg HTA team presented the new user interface of LUXATLAS.lu. It now distinguishes between "simple" access for normal users and "professional" access combining

all map layers and additional functions. It is planned to create a 3D reconstruction of all buildings in Luxembourg City combined with the cadastral plan.

5. Digital HTA updates

- Historia Urbium homepage, AWG section

DS noted the need for short entries for national HTAs for the AWG section. Rosa Smurra (ITA) announced the need for a new host for Historia Urbium as a whole but in the meantime AWG Section entries on HTAs may be directed to Francesca Bocchi (ITA).

Action: All HTA groups; HTA content needs to be reviewed and updated

ICHT website to be modified: AWG as a separate heading, not under activities. Action: AWG to liaise with ICHT Board.

- Wikipedia articles on Historic Towns Atlases

DS noted the opportunity presented by Wikipedia for publicising the HTA programme, indicating the Wikipedia page for the HTAs in Germany provide a useful exemplar for other HTAs. Question raised about the need for entries to be translated into English. Action: All non-German speaking HTA groups (please refer to: <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=E5XtJXMmST4>, for example)

- Atlas list and interactive map on atlases

DS drew attention to the continued updating of HTA information on published atlases as well as digital HTAs, hosted by IStG. There is a new short link to the content: <https://go.wwu.de/EuropeanHTA>.

Action: All to check information and advise DS of any updates and changes.

6. Comparative and collaborative initiatives:

- HOUSe Project

The Warsaw project “HOUSe – Historical Ontology of Urban Spaces” is completed (<https://urbanonto.ihpan.edu.pl/>). The results are to benefit digital HTA projects.

- HiSMaComp Project

DS outlined details of a new project under the title “HiSMaComp – Historic Survey Maps and the Comparative Study of the Functionality of Urban Space. Standardising – Digital Processing – Research” for comparing town types across Poland and Germany on the basis of the HOUSe ontology

- Geodata Respository

DS presented the Geodata Repository at IStG in Münster. Research data produced in the HTA projects using GIS can be published for re-use by other GIS-based projects in the near future. A prototype geoserver is installed, but not yet publically accessible. For any information please contact DS (stracked@uni-muenster.de)

- Automatised Digitisation

At the 2022 congress of the European Association for Urban History, KSz met representatives of a project run at the Ecole polytechnique fédérale de Lausanne who are working on the automatized digitization of cadastral maps. They offered collaboration with the AWG. Given the seat of the project, the best would be to make a pilot project on Swiss materials.

- European HTA book project

KL outlined an initiative for a comparative study drawing on European HTAs for a thematic analysis of urbanism and urbanisation; discussions with Thames & Hudson as a possible publisher so far inconclusive.

- Funding comparative HTA research (COST and H2020)

DS referred to a funding initiative led by Justin Colson (GB), comparing HTAs and with a strong digital dimension. KL noted Justin Colson is now Senior Lecturer in Digital and Urban History at University of London (Institute of Historical Research). Unfunded...

- CHANSE-Programm

KL outlined details of CHANSE funding bid addressing the theme of 'Transformations: Social and Cultural Dynamics in the Digital Age', led by Helen Fulton (GB) and involving collaborators connected with HTA projects in Germany, Great Britain and Poland. Project title is "CITYMAP: Transforming the Historic City through Digital Innovation in Mapping and Heritage".

It is known as an important university centre, with five state universities (including "Alexandru Ioan Cuza" University, the oldest in Romania, <https://www.uaic.ro/en/>) and one private university. The city is accessible by air, rail or road. The international airport (<https://www.aeroport-iasi.ro/>) is served by several 'traditional' and low-cost airlines (Tarom, Austrian Airlines, Wizzair, Blue Air, Hisky). For those who want to avoid the risks of the low-cost airlines (recently: delays, cancellations), we recommend using the 'traditional' airlines (Tarom, Austrian Airlines), which have direct flights to Iași from Bucharest and Vienna.

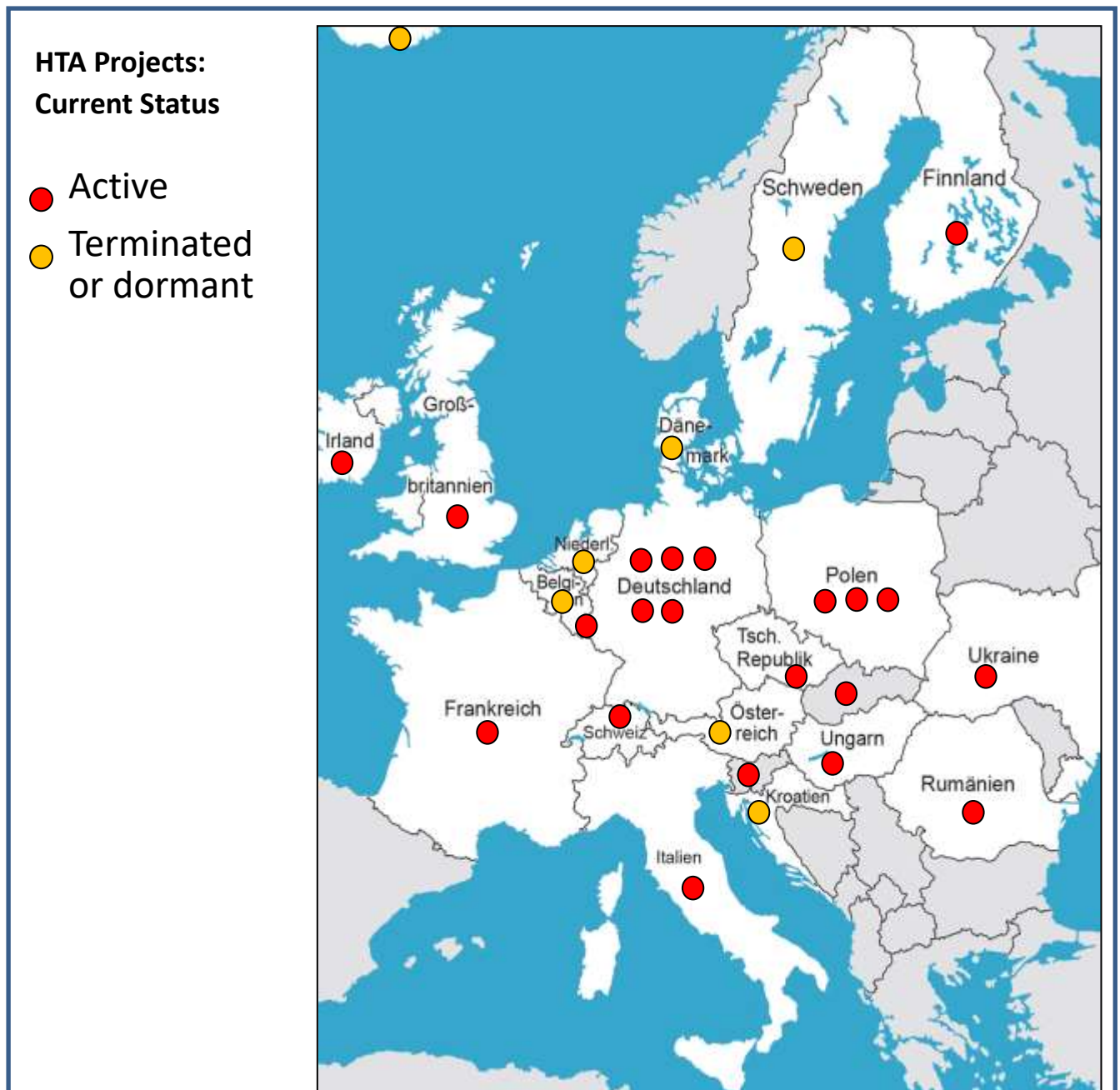

News: The Irish Historic Towns Atlas have been awarded a grant from the Heritage Council's Heritage Stewardship Fund 2023.

The project is entitled 'Placing our heritage: creating a digital atlas of the city of Cork' is an initiative of IHTA Digital and is being led by Sarah Gearty (Cartographic and managing editor, IHTA) and Dr Rachel Murphy (Chair of the IHTA Digital Working Group/University of Limerick). The project is designed to complement the forthcoming Irish Historic Towns Atlas, no. 31 *Cork/Corcaigh* by Howard B. Clarke and Máire Ní Laoí and will create an open and interactive online digital atlas of Cork. Project partners are the Digital Repository of Ireland and Cork City Council.

The digital atlas builds on research and mapping that has been in progress on Cork city for several years, particularly the digitising by Frank Cullen of the Ordnance Survey town plans (1842), for the creation of Map 2, which will be printed in the atlas following the usual guidelines and at the scale of 1:2500. The digital map has been produced in Arc GIS, which will be developed and will integrate c. 8000 site histories from the Topographical Information in an accompanying geodatabase. The original datasets for Cork will be available online, open access via the Digital Repository of Ireland (<https://www.dri.ie/>). This will be a step forward for the Irish atlas in building on core work and making digital resources available for others, developing previous initiatives on Derry~Londonderry, Galway and Dungarvan (<https://www.ria.ie/digital-atlases-gis>).

In memoriam **Susan Mary Grace Reynolds** (27 January 1929 – 29 July 2021)

Susan Reynolds, eminent member of the ICHT was an academic who changed the way historians think about the Middle Ages. She was the author of ground-breaking books in the medieval field such as 'Kingdoms and Communities in Western Europe, 900-1300 (1984)' and 'Fiefs and Vassals: The Medieval Evidence Reinterpreted (1994)'.

In memoriam **Desanka Kovačević-Kojić (Sarajevo, 1925 – Belgrade, 2022)**

As quietly as she lived, Prof. Dr Desanka Kovačević-Kojić passed away this summer, after more than six decades of active academic life, spent in her hometown of Sarajevo and in Belgrade. She was an exceptional scholar and a trailblazer for women in the humanities in the region – especially in medieval studies, urban and economic history. After Dr Kovačević-Kojić finished her thesis – *Commerce in the Medieval Bosnia* (1956; published in 1961), she spent a year at Sorbonne under the supervision of Fernand Braudel (1902–1985). From her very first to the last book and article, there is a single thread – meticulous work on voluminous archival materials, collected in Dubrovnik, Venice, Milan, and Florence. She taught at the Faculty of the Philosophy, University of Sarajevo, beginning from the post of teaching assistant to tenured position (1969), and she continued to publish excellent volumes on medieval history, which became classics and corner stones for future generations and disciples. Those are: “Medieval cities of the Bosnian state” (1978), “Trade books of Caboga brothers, 1426–1433” (1999), “City life in Serbia and Bosnia, 14th – 15th centuries” (2007 – these are collected volume of articles published from 1960s, including accounts of numerous marketplaces and towns: Sarajevo, Janjevo, Priština, Srebrenica, Borač, etc.), and most available for the international scientific community is the French edition: “La Serbie et les pays serbes : l’économie urbaine : XVe-XVe siècles” (2012). Her special area of interest was the influence of mining on urbanization of Serbia and Bosnia, as well as communal organization of mining towns, and this was emphasized in her monograph “Medieval Srebrenica, 14th – 15th centuries” (2010). Besides this volume, she contributed to a new synthesis “Old Serbian mining” (2002), co-authored by Sima Ćirković and Ruža Ćuk, another two exceptional medievalists of Serbia and Bosnia. She dedicated several articles to the calculation of the possible quantities of gold, silver and lead exported from medieval Serbia and Bosnia, as well as marketing through the commercial network of Dubrovnik in the whole Mediterranean trade. Furthermore, archival material from Dubrovnik helped her determine the location, number, and period of activity of the most significant merchants from Dubrovnik in their own “colonies,” placed in medieval cities throughout Bosnia and Serbia. Besides representatives of the most noble families of the commune, many distinguished and successful businessmen from local areas were co-opted to the ranks of the Dubrovnik citizens. The greater the number of those merchants, the more significant the cities, and with the advancement of the military presence of the Ottoman Empire, she pointed out to their migrations and re-routing of the trade flows from the interior of the Balkan peninsula.

Dr Kovačević-Kojić’s scientific achievements in medieval urban and economic studies were early recognized at home, where she was elected as the member of the Academy of Sciences and Arts in Sarajevo (1975, 1981) and in Belgrade (1995), as well as abroad – since 1979 she was a member of the International Commission for the History of Towns (ICHT), contributing with her expertise to occasional congresses and symposia, and, from 2004, she held an honorary position. Following her recommendation, my membership in this prestigious organization was accepted in 2014. A tribute volume for her was published in 2015, and the list of the international scholars who contributed is impressive and speaks about the influence her work inspired outside the Balkans.

We part with great sadness from Dr Kovačević-Kojić, a truly benevolent and supportive colleague, who left an admirable legacy that will serve as a model for the future scholarly work.
