2024 23-25 September on ' Discourses on the peculiarities of urban order' in Matera (Italy), Università degli studi della Basilicata (organisers: Francesco Panarelli, Rosa Smurra)

2025, September in Lubljana, Slovenia, organiser: Miha Kosi

The topic suggested by Miha Kosi, Martin Scheutz and Christoph Sonnlechner: *Uses of the Urban History Today / Urban History – Public History*. Urban History has become an intrinsic part of Public History of Towns, Public History tries often to bridge Academic and Public world. The Conference in Ljubljana will be based on the new Town Atlas of Ljubljana (by Miha Kosi). Based on GIS-Town Atlases the Conference should offer the different ways of Public History and Urban History: Town Atlases, Town Wikis, Game History and Urban History, Emotions and Learning in Museum (Ecomuseums), Citizen Science Projects and so on. A special focus could be laid on Jože Plečnik (1872–1957) and his urban transformation of the City and this approach to Public History.

(6) New four-year program

Suggestion by Steinar Aas: *Dichotomies of Urban History*

Historians tend to use dichotomies as a starting point for methodological or theoretical considerations. The dichotomies are defined to be a division or contrast between two things that are or are represented as being opposed or entirely different. The way we tend to contrast or divide in two seems to be common within the field of urban history as well. Social matters could be dealt with in the tension between rich and poor, between elites and masses, or men and women, and politics could be seen to be divided between city and state, or church and nobility, stability and change, stagnation and expansion. In other urban studies we tend to have an approach to urban studies studying order and chaos, destruction and reconstruction, law and unrest, planning and disorganization etc. Other dichotomies organizing our perspectives could be divided between conflict and harmony, health and unhealth, inside and outside, and so forth. The reason for choosing dichotomies as a topic for the next four years is that it could then include urban research on a vast area of topics, and simultaneously be concentrated on the same cut and scope for the debate. This makes it easier to organize conferences as well as to unify the topics that are at hand for discussions. It also gives the commission a possibility to offer a wide range of perspectives and case studies wit-

in different chronological periods, circling around the same themes, giving us the possibility to circle around different methodological or theoretical approaches to urban history.

"Dichotomies" could in a way be an umbrella. Under which we organize the next four years. This means that we could decide to take 2025 as the starting point of a conference on for instance "destruction and reconstruction", or "order and chaos", or "law and unrest", or even "center and hinterland". The umbrella helps us to focus on some conceptions within the concept of Urban history that are relevant to be addressed, while giving us the necessary flexibility.

4. Comparative and collaborative initiatives:

4.1 HiSMaComp Project

The joint Polish-German HiSMaComp Project is using survey maps and additional historic data to compare six towns based on three town types (metropolises, ecclesiastic towns and spa towns). The digital research agenda focuses on geodata (GIS) combined with an ontology. The project has organized a series of workshops (see 5.2, below) and a final conference to be held in Münster in 2025. Principal investigator: Roman Czaja, co-investigator: Daniel Stracke

4.2 Geodata Repository

Project geodata are as valuable a resource for future urban studies as are maps. In connection with the HiSMaComp Project, a geodata repository is being set up at the IStG in Münster which currently is in the trial phase. The midterm goal is to provide an infrastructure for geodata publication for all European HTA projects.

4.3 Automatised Digitisation

AI-based vectorisation has been on trial in various projects, but results are so far not sufficient. Active members are advised to look for partners as this field will grow and become more relevant for project cartographers.

4.4 Funding programmes (bi-/multi-national)

There is an ongoing initiative to co-fund Ukrainian and German atlas work, but the outcome is not yet decided.

5.1 Digital Standards Group (regular)

The DSG is part of the AWG. Active members meet monthly in order to establish basic workflows and data/metadata standards for the GIS-based HTA projects. Niklas Alt (niklas.alt@uni-marburg.de) has kindly taken over organisation of meetings from Daniel Stracke. All members interested are welcome.


Conference of the International Commission for the History of Towns (ICHT) Matera, 23-25 September 2024

Organisers: International Commission for the History of Towns (ICHT) with Università degli studi della Basilicata ' Discourses on the peculiarities of urban order ' At the conclusion of the four-year program on Urban Order, the ICHT 2024 Conference has as its focus the Discourses on the peculiarities of urban order, a theme also identified by ICHT because of its considerable relevance especially in times of political tension and social fragility. To explore the Discourses on the peculiarities of urban order the ICHT 2024 conference will take a comparative historical and geographical approach. Indeed, a long-term historical perspective with a broad geographic spectrum allows for the study of the multiple forms in which ideas of urban order are formed and developed in European cities. The talks will cover Discourses on the peculiarities of urban order produced by various actors - secular and ecclesiastical authorities, formalized groups - in the medieval, modern and contemporary periods. This call invites speakers to explore possible discourses on urban order with their spatial, cultural and material impacts and manifestations in the urban context. Prompted by political, economic, religious, and social instances, discourses on urban order contribute to the definition of cultural patterns, political, religious and trade practices - just to name a few- that find their way into a wide repertoire of textual sources and documentary domains such as for example chronicles, treatises, ecclesiastical order, urban administration, mass-media, literature, debates on town-planning etc. How do they argue about urban order? How far do they follow older discourses? In which form is urban order conceived? Are they displayed in the public, kept by authorities, or do they form part of learned disputes? Possible areas of research include: the use and manipulation of urban order discourses to support political projects, the establishment or revision of hierarchies and social orders within cities, the design of new urban areas or the remodeling of the existing ones

Note that all papers will be peer-reviewed in order to assess their originality, methodology, quality of writing and overall contribution to the conference theme. No more than fifteen proposals will be accepted. Information about Matera: Matera is a city of 60.000 inhabitants in southern Italy, in the Basilicata region. Matera is famous for its ancient rock-cut dwellings, concentrated in two districts called Sassi, which were designated a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1993. The city is also one of the two seats, along with Potenza, of the University of Basilicata. Matera is well connected with Bari-Palese International Airport and Bari Centrale railway station. From Bari Centrale railway station there is a direct connection to Matera (Ferrovie Appulo-lucane: <https://ferrovieappulolucane.it/>), whereas from the airport one can take the train to Bari Centrale Station (<https://www.ferrovienordbarese.it/orari>) and from there continue to Matera, or take bus, shuttle or cab service directly from Bari-Palese Airport to Matera.

I am a graduate of the master's degree programme in History and the Czech Language with a specialization for Secondary Schools at the Faculty of Education of the University of Hradec Králové (2001) and a doctoral study programme in Auxiliary Historical Sciences completed at the Department of Auxiliary Historical Sciences and Archive Studies of the Faculty of Arts of Charles University, supervised by Prof. PhDr. Ivan Hlaváček, CSc. (2008). The topic of my dissertation was communication between the royal towns in the period before the Battle of White Mountain (1620).² Since 2001, I have been working at the University of Hradec Králové, until 2022 at the *Department of Auxiliary Sciences of History and Archival Studies*, and from the same year at the *Institute of History*. As part of the lectures and seminars, I specialize in courses in auxiliary historical sciences, history of medieval and early modern administration system, edition theory and practice, early modern history, and urban history. In 2018, I received a docentship (pedagogical-scientific degree of Reader or Associate Professor) in the field of *Czech and Czechoslovak History*. I am currently the guarantor of two doctoral study programmes: *Archival Science* and *Auxiliary Historical Sciences*. I also work as the head of the *Centre for Urban History*, established in 2017 at the University of Hradec Králové, and as an organizing researcher specializing in urban history. In addition to publishing and lecturing activities, one of the centre's main areas of activity is the resolution of important external projects (on this, cf. the NAKI II and III projects, completed under tenders for the Ministry of Culture of the Czech Republic).³ Within the framework of international cooperation, I cooperate with the Department of History of the University of Pavol Jozef Šafárik in Košice, which specializes in urban history. Currently, I have with Dr. Drahoslav Magdoško one of the main sections at the EAUH 2024 *Cities at the Boundaries* conference.⁴ At the beginning of October 2023, I am leaving for Barcelona with the doctoral students, where we will hold a three-day workshop with the Polytechnic University there and architects-urban planners focusing on the royal cities founded in Bohemia in the 13th century by Přemysl Otakar II. The working language will be English. The event is based on the interest of Prof. Antonio Moro, who has devoted himself to the research topic for many years and combines the top knowledge of the profession with the knowledge of historians in order to preserve the cultural heritage of this group of towns. In terms of my other activities, I would highlight the fact that I am an evaluator of the National Accreditation Office, which assesses the quality of study programmes at Czech universities. I am also an evaluator of the quality of publication outputs for the relevant calendar year within the Czech Republic. (A body au-

thorized by the Government of the Czech Republic.) I am also a member of several editorial boards, and from January 2024 I will take over the position of editor-in-chief of the *Archive Magazine* (Archivní časopis), published since 1951. I speak English and German, have a passive knowledge of Russian and Polish and the basics of French. I can translate Latin texts.

In the long term, I have dealt with the medieval and early modern history of towns in the area of the Czech lands and in the Central European context. In the framework of source research, I apply modern methodological approaches of a number of scientific disciplines, including the auxiliary sciences of history, legal history, and historical geography. One of my main specialisations is medieval and early modern urban diplomatics and research of municipal chancelleries. Because I also deal with the historical development of the Czech language during the Middle Ages and the early modern period, I have co-edited, for example, the codification of the *Municipal Laws* from 1579 or the codification of Bohemian land law, *Vladislav's Land Constitution* from 1500. In 2018–2022, I took part in the preparation of volumes of the *Historical Atlas of Towns of the Czech Republic* (as part of the **five-year external project** *Dowry Towns of the Bohemian Queens* (project of NAKI II = National Cultural Identity II), these were volumes for the towns of Polička, Jaroměř, Vysoké Mýto, Dvůr Králové nad Labem).⁵ Since 2023, I am a co-investigator of the **five-year external project** *Historical Spa Seats as a Cultural, Urbanistic, and Landscape-forming Phenomenon* (project of NAKI III = National Cultural Identity III), within the framework of which volumes will be created for the towns of Mariánské Lázně, Karlovy Vary, and Františkovy Lázně (a collaboration with Dr. Robert Šimůnek). In 2022, I completed a month-long research stay at the *Institute for Comparative Urban History* in Münster.

Obituaries:

Máximo Diago Hernando

(Soria, 1963 – Madrid, 2024)

The unexpected death of Máximo Diago, when he already seemed to have recovered from the serious illness he suffered two years ago, is a great loss for Spanish medievalism, and causes a strong feeling of sadness in those of us who knew him and appreciated both his good personal qualities and the merit of his work.

Dr. Diago studied at the Faculty of Geography and History of the Complutense University (Madrid), where he obtained his PhD in 1990. He was postdoctoral fellow at the University of Cologne (1993-1994), and researcher at the *Institución Milá y Fontanals* (Spanish National Research Council - CSIC), in Barcelona (1996-1999). He was later Senior Researcher at the Institute of History of the CSIC, in Madrid, from 1999 until his death. Dr. Diago was an active member of the International Commission for the History of Towns between 2009 and 2022, and Corresponding Member of the Royal Academy of History (Madrid) since 2017.

He was the author of nine books and more than 200 research articles and book chapters. His work as editor of more than 400 reviews, most of them published in the Journal *Anuario de Estudios Medievales*, has also been very notable and beneficial for his Spanish colleagues.

His main research dealt with the history of the cities of Castile between the 14th and 16th centuries, based on his PhD dissertation on Soria and its territory, and has given rise to publications that address a large number and variety of aspects, sometimes introducing comparisons with the situation in German cities. His extensive knowledge has also allowed him to make excellent syntheses about the Revolt of the Comuneros of Castile (1520-1522).

He also dedicated many publications to trade between Castile and Aragon, especially that of textile products. At the same time, he carried out important research on transhumance livestock farming in Castile, between the 14th and 17th centuries, and the Mesta (an association of livestock owners that regulated transhumance). He was one of the best experts on this basic topic in Castilian economic history.

Furthermore, he regularly researched archives, with unpublished documents, and discovered and published many informations of interest about individuals and social groups of those centuries, including the Jewish and Muslim minorities.

Máximo Diago put his outstanding intelligence and extraordinary work capacity at the service of the historical research. The result is a solid and innovative work, which will deserve recognition for a long time to come. Rest in peace.

In memoriam Jean-Marie Duvosquel (29 january 1946- 18 november 2023)

After a short disease Jean-Marie Duvosquel died on November 18th 2023 in Brussels. He was born in the little village of Ploegsteert (nowadays Comines-Warneton) and stayed during his whole life attached and committed to his hometown and its history. Already at a very young age, he manifested an outspoken interest in local history, so it came as no surprise that he decided to study history at the free university of Brussels (ULB) where he was trained as a classic mediaevalist and graduated in 1968. His master's degree was obtained under the direction of Georges Despy, on the subject of the abbey of Maroilles in Hainault during the Merovingian period. He started to work on a PhD concerning the demesne of the bishop and chapter of Cambrai during the 9th-13th centuries. Since the possibilities to continue a traditional academic career were already scarce, he passed the examinations in order to become an archivist, but finally choose to enter in 1973 the cultural department (Pro Civitate) of the bank 'Crédit communal de Belgique-Gemeentekrediet van België'. He rose gradually in the ranks and finally became head of the cultural department which allowed him to organise and stimulate historical research aimed in the first place at the study of the history of towns, as the Crédit communal had been founded in 1860 as the bank for local and regional entities. No less than 100 specific publications (PhD's and proceedings of colloquia) in the Pro Civitate series were published under his direction, together with prestigious editions (the so-called Ferraris maps, albums de Croÿ to name but the best known), a dictionary of Belgian communes, and a series of town atlases. The demise of the bank and of its French successor Dexia bank however put an end to this prolific engagement. The Pro Civitate prize for urban history however continues till today and Jean-Marie Duvosquel remained till shortly before his death a member of its committee, active in the context of the Royal Academy. Thanks to this crucial position in a bank marked by an outspoken cultural (and historical) engagement, he was able to stimulate and make possible much research which has been essential for the promotion of urban history in Belgium. He was elected member of the Royal Academy in 1991 and of the Royal commission for History in 1995. In 1993 he returned to his alma mater where he taught specific courses on cultural management and cartography. In the meantime he had also become thanks to the then active president Adriaan Verhulst member of the International Commission for the History of Towns, as such he co-organised among others the meeting at Spa in 1996 on the topic of the destruction of towns, published as last book (nr. 100) in the Pro Civitate series in 1999. Though many of his activities took place in a national Belgian context he stayed during his life time active on the local level, in his hometown of Comines-Warneton but also in the town of Saint-Hubert in the Ardennes, the region his wife originated from and where he had his holiday house. Many of his publications and source-editions refer to these regions.

At the occasion of his 65th birthday a Festschrift in two volumes was published, it contains a full list of his publications and a biographical essay: Alain Dierkens, Christophe Loir, Denis Morsa, Guy Vanthemsche (ed.), *Villes et villages, organization et représentation de l'espace. Mélanges offerts à Jean-Marie Duvosquel à l'occasion de son soixante-cinquième anniversaire*, Bruxelles, Timperman, 2011 (also as issue 89 of the Revue Belge de Philologie et d'Histoire, 2011).
