## Atlas Working Group Meeting in Matera, 2024 – Minutes

Day: Monday September 23, 2024

Venue: Campus Università della Basilicata, Via Lanera 20, Matera

### Atlas Working Group Meeting (Chair: Daniel Starcke)

#### **10:30 Welcome and Introduction**

On behalf of the AWG Convenors, Daniel Stracke welcomed the participants on site and presented a brief review of the current state of the European Historic Towns Atlas as a whole.

According to the IStG, count by September 2024 all in all 611 printed Historic Towns Atlases were published by the national and regional projects all over Europe – a remarkable achievement. Since 1969 and in the early 1970s, the take-off was initiated by the British and German projects and the first phase was dominated by larger instalments with longer intervals in between. Then, projects in Austria, Ireland, Italy as well as Central and Eastern Europe started publishing. Especially from the late 1990s onwards, the publishing rhythm became steadier with single volumes being put out. So far, Germany with its early national and five regional projects is covered best, but Austria, France, Poland and others follow suit. Of the print output, many atlases are represented on project homepages (531), in online content like interactive maps or web GIS (268), but so far only a few are downloadable as PDFs (43).

#### **10:35 EHTA National Programmes — Updates and plans**

##### **1) A number of project reports were delivered on site:**

###### GERMANY/National – Daniel Stracke

This year we have published the 7<sup>th</sup> volume of the German National HTA (*Deutscher Historischer Städteatlas*) for Magdeburg. The series is a follow-up to the former *Deutscher Städteatlas* published between 1973 and 2000.

Magdeburg's history spans more than 1200 years. Starting off as an early medieval trading outpost, the place was developed first by emperor Otto I into a royal seat of power and archepiscopal see. It was the archbishops who developed the town further and with its significant growth, its town rights became the model for many central and eastern European towns. Twice, Magdeburg's development was cut short by near complete war-related destructions, in 1631 and 1945.

The vast expanse of the complex group-town Magdeburg meant many challenges to our

mapping efforts, e.g. for the 1:2,500 base map and the developmental phases map 1:5,000. The printed atlas is flanked by seven web modules published in our information portal [www.staedtegeschichte.de](http://www.staedtegeschichte.de). They were developed from a combination of the atlas's historic and thematic GIS data made interactive using the Leaflet library in HTML. Programming the split-screen, transparency and time-slider functions were new territory for our cartographer, Oliver Rathmann.

#### GERMANY/Mecklenburg – Martin Ebert

The Historic Towns Atlas of Mecklenburg is a new publication series focussing on the 38 towns in the historic German region of Mecklenburg that were planted in the 13<sup>th</sup> century and endowed with town privileges. Research combines written records, archaeology, and cartographic sources to study town formation processes and urban development from the 13<sup>th</sup> century to the Reformation (1552).

The individual atlases work according to a common scheme (headings: A Introduction and previous research, B Town and landscape, C Morphological analysis, D Periphery, E Urban Functions, F Literature) and collect all scientifically relevant information on the town's history, development and urban form.

The first volume on Malchin, presented as a pre-print in Matera, will be released in 2025, followed by Woldegk (2026) and Friedland. The volumes published exclusively in English are peer-reviewed and embedded in academic work and events as well as outreach and consulting activities.

#### HUNGARY – Judit Majorossy

The Hungarian project was initiated in 2004 and has now entered its fourth phase, prolonged to September 2025.

Current work focusses on the town of Pest with a 1871 cadastral map and various thematic maps on Roman settlements and encampments, deserted places after the 1241(42 Mongol invasion, and reconstructions of medieval settlement structures. The Pest atlas combines with the previous volumes on Óbuda, Buda I (up to 1686) and Buda II (1686–1848) for documenting the history and development of the Hungarian capitol Budapest in texts, gazetteers and maps.

#### IRELAND – Sarah Gearty

In the IHTA main series, no. 31, *Cork/Corcaigh* by H.B. Clarke and Máire Ní Laoi was published in May 2024 in a slightly new format with 2000 copies printed. The atlas was launched in Cork city on 14 May 2024 and the following day a seminar on the city and the atlas was held, attended by over 100 people. Alongside the printed atlas, the Digital Atlas of Cork/Corcaigh (a project led by Sarah Gearty and Rachel Murphy) was released online in December last year. It was created in ArcGIS Experience Builder in consultation with ESRI Ireland and contains information to 6,245 historic sites. Currently, the team works on this material being uploaded to the Digital Repository of Ireland (DRI). We will have an official launch of both the printed and the digital atlases by An Tánaiste Michael Martin on 21 November in the Royal Irish Academy.

Another volume of the series of ancillary publications was released, entitled *Town and country: perspectives from the Irish Historic Towns Atlas*, by editors Sarah Gearty and Michael Potterton in October of last year. With conferences and workshops as well as the

Maynooth University SPUR studentship (six weeks through July/August), a lot of outreach activities were organised. Looking to the next year, the Irish team are focused now on the town of Ballyshannon, Co. Donegal (by Angela Byrne) and Drumcondra in the Dublin Suburbs series (by Ruth McManus, commission member).

The atlas team regrets to announce that their board member Professor Raymond Gillespie died after a short illness in January.

#### ITALY – Rosa Smurra and Valentina Orioli

The recently published work of the Italian Historic Towns Atlas project situated in Bologna refers to the town of Cingoli, a small town perched on a prominent hilltop in the province of Macerata. The atlas documents such themes as the Roman and Medieval stages of development, prominent buildings, like palaces and the town hall, as well as the geological and hydrological situation of the area. The rich geological map with the distribution of watercourses is particularly important, because of the floods that occurred in the region in recent years. The new AWG member Valentina Orioli reported on the ongoing work for the Atlante storico of Cesena which is at very good stage and will hopefully be presented in 2025.

#### ITALY/Sardinia – Marco Cadinu

The team working on Italian towns on the island of Sardegna presented work in progress on the three towns: Iglesias, Bosa and Oristano, all situated in its western part. The medieval towns in Sardegna where various Mediterranean regions intersect date from the 11<sup>th</sup> to the 13<sup>th</sup> century. The river port town of Bosa was founded in the 12<sup>th</sup> century and enlarged in the 13<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup> century with the castle on the hill, a new part of the town, and town walls built by Mariano IV (1354). The town of Iglesias was founded in 1272 by Pisa and a new wall was built in the 1320s. Oristano also is a port town from the 11<sup>th</sup>–12<sup>th</sup> c. with impressive town walls.

The work of the interdisciplinary group is based on previous projects and now conducted in GIS. It includes the cadastre as well as the documentation of monuments. Current plans include a digital version, published in Open Access, as well as a limited number of printed copies.

#### LUXEMBURG – Martin Uhrmacher

The digital atlas on Luxembourg features a great variety of historic maps, interactive map layers with clickable objects, images, and texts referring to objects, source material as well as the project methodology. Of particular interest was the introduction of interactive images (e.g. a panoramic view of 1753) as story maps and the initial work on a 3D application. The latter draws on a large number of sources presented and serves as proof-of-concept for the emerging future version LUXATLAS 4.0. Help-tutorials highlight the main interactions with the increasingly complex atlas for the user.

The present year has seen the preparation for the next funding phase starting in 2025 in which the LUXATLAS will be developed further, and a new content management system will be implemented

### POL – Roman Czaja

As general editor of the series, Roman Czaja reported on the work of the regional teams preparing the Historical Atlas of Polish Towns (*Atlas Historyczny Miast Polskich*). In 2024, a grant funded by the „National Program for the Development of Humanities” of the Minister of Science and Higher Education was of particular importance for the project’s publishing progress. As part of this grant, two towns atlases could be published for Lesser Poland (*Małopolska*), edited by Zdzisław Noga, on the towns Tarnów and Zamość (as fasc. 6 and 9 in volume V: Lesser Poland).

Four more atlases have been submitted for printing under this program, i.e. Kwidzyn/Marienwerder (fasc. 5 in volume III: Masuria and Ducal Prussia) as well as Tczew/Dirschau, Puck/Putzig, and Lidzbark Warmiński/Heilsberg (fasc. 10, 11 and 12 in volume I: Royal Prussia and Ermland).

The team under the direction of Rafał Eysymontt working on Silesian towns at the University of Wrocław also received a grant from the “National Program for the Development of Humanities” for the preparation of atlases for towns in the Kodzko region (see separate report), and the Toruń team has applied for funding to prepare and print another 11 atlases over the next five years.

The team from Gdansk under the direction of Wiesław Długokęcki has prepared an atlas of the city of Gdańsk/Danzig (fasc. 9 in volume I: Royal Prussia and Ermland). The editor and the University of Gdansk Publishing House are seeking funds for printing the atlas.

As part of the joint Polish-German project HiSMaComp (see separate report), work is underway to prepare the historical atlas of Warszawa/Warsaw for printing (which will be the first fascicle of the volume VII: Masowia) as well as the atlas of Olsztyn/Allenstein (to become fasc. 13 of volume I: Royal Prussia and Ermland).

### POL/Silesia – Radek Glinski

The work on the atlas of Brzeg (no.18) has already been completed and we are now waiting for it to be printed. The new project is concerned with the preparation of three further atlases on towns situated in Kłodzko County in Lower Silesia near the Czech border: Bystrzyca Kłodzka, Nowa Ruda and Radków. Our new challenge is the question of how to visualise in atlases the height diversity of the terrain in order to show the strategy of locating towns in mountainous terrain. Another issue is how to represent the mining town, which is extremely stretched in space due to its industrial facilities.

## **2) Further reports were submitted in writing:**

### GER/Hesse – Niklas Alt/Malanie Müller-Bering

In preparation is an atlas on Hirschhorn (Neckar), the first to be produced (as far as possible) according to the currently developed guidelines of the HTA Digital Standards Group. The publication is planned for 2025.

The latest volume in the regional Historic Towns Atlas for Hesse, on Fulda, was published in 2019. Since then, several projects were built that are based it. Presently there is ongoing work on Urban Green in Fulda (places of historic greenery, gardens and parks in the town via

maps, photographs, drawings etc. and short, descriptive texts, released 2023 [<https://www.lagis-hessen.de/maps/gruen-in-fulda/home>]) and a Digital Building directory of Fulda, based on cadastral maps and construction records since the 1860/70s.

The project Urkataster+ (Cadastral Maps Project) features georeferenced cadastral maps in a web application [<https://www.lagis-hessen.de/maps/urkataster-plus/overview>]. It was started in 2020 and is continuously expanded.

#### GER/Rhineland – Wolfgang Rosen

Recently, the project covering towns in the northern Rhineland has focused on smaller towns such as Angermund (today part of Düsseldorf), Siegburg (near Bonn), and Kaster and Oedt (Lower Rhine region). Last year, *Rheinischer Städteatlas* was able to present volume 106 on the small town of Waldfeucht in the Lower Rhine region, located directly on the Dutch border. Later this year, Gräfrath in the Bergisches Land, first mentioned in 1135, will be published as No 107. The town had a large iron trade (knifemaking), but is no longer an independent town as it was – like several others – incorporated into Solingen in 1929. In the coming years, the focus will also be on smaller places or former towns such as Waldbröl (a former district town in the Oberbergisches Land), Homburg in the Oberbergisches Land, originally a *Freiheit* (liberty) belonging to the castle, Deutz and Ehrenfeld (now parts of Cologne). Recently, new and younger atlas authors have been recruited and two new GIS-using cartographers could be employed.

In addition, the LVR Institute for Regional Studies and Regional History has been digitising the previous editions of the city atlas for some time; eleven atlases can already be viewed on the internet (<https://rheinische-geschichte.lvr.de/node/49>).

#### GER/Westphalia – Tobias Kniep

The towns and cities within the German region of Westphalia (part of North Rhine-Westphalia) are covered by two consecutive Historic Towns Atlas series: the former “Westfälischer Städteatlas” (Westphalian Towns Atlas) and the current “Historischer Atlas westfälischer Städte” (Historic Atlas of Westphalian Towns). The first one was published from 1975-2010 and consisted of 11 instalments containing various volumes. In total 80 towns have been edited.

After a complete conceptual renovation, the newly designed Atlas accommodates a comprehensive booklet accompanied by a multitude of plans, thematic maps and reproductions. So far, 18 volumes have been published. Since the last meeting with the Atlas Working Group there have been two new publications from Westphalia: Witten (No. 17) and Emsdetten (No. 18). The former played a key role in the industrialization of the Ruhr valley with its ingenious entrepreneurship and plentiful mineral resources. And the latter is typical of a specimen of Westphalian small towns: the rise and demise of a monoindustry (textile), steady but continuous growth and finally a faint diversification of commerce with a high commuter rate. Both towns have been mere villages in times of the first survey but experienced rapid increase of housing and built-up areas. Ideal for cartographic comparison and time sequences.

Since 2021 GIS has been part of the cartographic workflow and the project produces reusable geodata. To this effect, a concept for digital publishing and visualisation is currently being developed. So far, the commission has been able to produce a lightweight homepage with bibliographic information, appropriately laid out atlas texts and maps as well as a basic

interactive map to compare town layouts (for all towns edited in both Westphalian atlas series i.e. 98 webmaps). It is our first step to web cartography.

#### FRA – Sandrine Lavaud

Following the production of six atlases of Aquitaine's leading cities (2009-2019), this year saw the publication of no 55 in the collection: the Atlas historique de Besançon, edited by Marie-Laure Bassi and Thomas Chenal, published by Ausonius-Éditions. The presentation ceremony at Besançon town hall took place on September 3, 2024.

The composition of the book complies with the collection's specifications: historical plan (pocket of 2 plates at 1:2500 and 1:5000 scale), t. 1, General notice (449 p.) and t. 2, Sites and monuments (653 p.). The remarkable work carried out by the team makes this a work of high scientific quality, which profoundly renews the history of the town by taking stock of the abundant archaeological and textual data. For the collection, it ensures better coverage of Eastern France, where few towns have been the subject of an atlas, while remaining on the scale of the head towns that once held the rank of city.

The Atlas historique de Nice, currently being produced under the direction of Philippe Jansen and Marc Boiron, should be a step in the same direction, and it is hoped that these new atlases will encourage other towns to apply in the future. The collection has also been selected for a “publisher's carte blanche” at the Rendez-vous de l'histoire de Blois, which this year will be on the theme of the city (October 11-13, 2024); this will be an opportunity for us to present the collection at a round-table discussion.

Despite the French collection's strong momentum, it is facing a number of problems that require it to evolve. For example, the recent experience of the Besançon atlas has shown the growing difficulty of publishing on paper, faced with rising printing costs and the scarcity of specialized printers (particularly for map production and folding).

While the printed atlas is well received by researchers, urban planners and heritage enthusiasts alike, the digital mode, either jointly or exclusively, would nonetheless solve the problem of stock depletion and reprinting, and above all provide the possibility of updating data. Its implementation requires a major dedicated program.

#### On other projects

Further atlases are currently being prepared by the teams in Romania, the Czech Republic, Slovakia, and Slovenia. The work was reported on last year and is ongoing. From Finland and Ukraine no new atlas projects are reported.

### **11:30 Summary and discussion**

Among the problems, questions, and topical issues raised during the discussion were financing, translations, outreach activities, and the digitisation of the atlases.

The need for translations is pressing in German atlases, especially, because German is diminishing as a researchers' language, despite being one of the official languages used by the ICHT. Many other project publications already feature English translations of the whole atlas or its main parts.

The Irish HTA project's pocket maps, something similar is also produced in the British HTA, found great interest in the auditorium, both for generating more public interest in the atlases and as a kick-off to tap financial resources for producing a larger atlas.

It has been suggested to look for atlas funds not only with the usual research funding institutions but also to apply for support to state institutions focussing on commerce and regional development.

While the print atlases are going strong and still to be considered the main output, digital atlas content was also discussed as very important: The use of GIS technology provides re-usable geodata as a basis for further research and town planning and may soon be published on the infrastructure developed at IStG in Münster. The Luxembourg all-digital project (LUXATLAS) is a lab for innovations, e.g. by integrating town views with geodata and 3D projections.

  - By now, Wikipedia is THE generally accepted info resource on all kinds of subjects.
  - Searches directly within Wikipedia don't show your external websites.
  - Wikipedia interlinks information so that for example people seeking information on urban history, town plan analysis, cartography, the ICHT, have a chance to find information on your atlas and all European HTA projects.

## **ICHT Conference 2026, Kaunas, 10-12 September 2026**

### **Forgetting and Remembering the Past in Urban History**

Based on Steinar Aas proposal for 4 years program “Dichotomies of Urban History”.

Organizers: The International Commission for History of Towns and Vytautas Magnus University

In 2026, a new four-year ICHT program called “Dichotomies of Urban History” (suggested by Steinar Aas) will begin. The first conference of this program, titled “Forgetting and Remembering the Past in Urban History”, invites researchers to focus on memory issues in the history of cities.

The processes of forgetting and remembering the past in urban history are intricate phenomena that involve the dynamic interplay of collective memory, urban development, and cultural identity. Urban spaces frequently function as repositories of collective memory, encapsulating the complex interactions between historical events and contemporary experiences. Elements of the built environment, such as street names, monuments, and public spaces, play a crucial role in forming and preserving urban memory. Semiotics and signs as well as myths and popular historical narratives could also be part of this formation or preservation process. Institutional providers of cultural memory are also often established to commemorate, while others may be torn down or eliminated to contribute to the forgetting.

The objective of this conference is to investigate the urban spaces of forgetting and remembrance, seeking sources that reveal which aspects of our multifaceted urban past are remembered and which are consigned to oblivion. The conference aims to examine how traumatic events (e.g., natural disasters, urban fires, wars, occupations) and joyful occurrences (e.g., periods of liberation, rapid growth, celebrations, festivals) are documented in historical sources and categorized, and how these processes influence the cultural identity of cities.

We cordially invite submissions from scholars examining the urban past across various historical periods, from the antiquity to modern times. It would be a pleasure to meet with you in Kaunas and have a possibility to exchange our thoughts, ideas and views.

#### Information about Kaunas

Kaunas is the second-largest city (about 300 000 inhabitants) in Lithuania and a unique centre of culture, education, and history in the Baltic region. Located at the confluence of the Nemunas and Neris rivers, Kaunas was first mentioned in written sources in the 14th century and received self-government rights in 1408, which spurred its development as a key trading hub. In the years 1920-1940, Kaunas served as Lithuania's temporary capital and became renowned for its distinctive modernist architecture, now recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage site. The city's historic Old Town features landmarks such as remnants of the Kaunas Castle, the Town Hall, and the Hanseatic League trading post, reflecting its dynamic medieval past. Among the many sacred sites, Kaunas offers visitors four Gothic churches, the Baroque masterpiece of Pažaislis Camaldolese Monastery, and the modernist Christ's Resurrection Basilica, whose terrace reveals panoramic views of the city centre. The legacy of Soviet occupation is still symbolized by the austere panel block residential districts in Kaunas, which contemporary city residents are gradually trying to transform. During history, Kaunas experienced multiple transfers, the city scape still carries visible signs of these changes and offers a powerful backdrop for reflecting on memory and change. Today, Kaunas is both a window into Lithuania's historical transformations and a lively European city with a multicultural heritage.

Although Kaunas has its own airport, Vilnius Airport offers a greater variety of flight options. The Lithuanian capital, Vilnius, is about 100 km from Kaunas, and these cities are conveniently connected by trains and buses running approximately every half hour.

Valentina Orioli (Cesena, 1971), architect and PhD, is associate professor of Urban planning at the Department of Architecture (DA) of the University of Bologna and councilor at the Municipality of Bologna in charge for New mobility, Infrastructures, Public transport, 30 km/h City, Protection of cultural heritage and historical gardens. In the administrative mandate 2016-21 she was councilor in charge for Urban Planning, Real Estate, Environment, Preservation and Renewal of the Historic City, Green Deal and Nomination of 'I Portici di Bologna' to Unesco WHL, and deputy mayor since 2020. As councilor and deputy mayor she participated in the formation of the metropolitan Sustainable Urban Mobility Plan (approved in 2019); promoted the Bologna Charter for the Environment (2017) and the formation and approval of the General Urban Plan and the Action Plan for Sustainable Energy and Climate, both approved in 2021. She was also responsible for the Portici dossier, which led to the inscription in the UNESCO World Heritage List in the same year. Valentina graduated as an architect at the IUAV in Venice in 1996 and obtained in the same year the professional qualification in Architecture. She became PhD in "Civil and territorial engineering" at the University of Bologna in 2003. In 2005 she became a researcher in the field of Urban planning at the University of Bologna, DA, Faculty of Architecture "Aldo Rossi". She is associate professor at the Department of Architecture since September 2014. In 2023 she obtained the qualification to Full Professor. Valentina participated in several European research programs, including the "Culture 2000" program "Architecture and Society of the Holiday Camps. History and perspectives" (2006-2007); the H2020 ROCK project (2017-2020); the Erasmus Plus ARCHEA project (2018-2022). At the national level, she recently participated in the research project "Housing shapes: experiences of urban and architectural "remodelage" in social housing districts", financed by PRIN 2009 program; she is participating in the project "Metropolitan territories under PNRR" financed by the PRIN 2022 program as coordinator of the research team of Bologna. Her many areas of expertise, both in teaching than in research activities, lead with urban history and morphology, strategic urban design and the planning/design tools at the urban scale. She published several essays on social housing and second post-war housing districts; on the design of public spaces and infrastructures in the contemporary cities; on the planning tools for urban development and urban regeneration. Valentina carried out research on the history of seaside districts and their contemporary transformation for many years since 2003. She published many essays

concerning these themes and she participated in many International and National Conferences. In 2012 she was the scientific coordinator of the International Symposium "Milano Marittima 100. Landscape and Architecture for seaside tourism", and she was the editor of the book "Milano Marittima 100. Paesaggi e architetture per il turismo balneare" and the curator of the exhibition "Milano Marittima 100. Le architetture e la città" (with Emanuele Dari). In 2013 she was the editor of the book "Spiagge urbane. Territori e architetture per il turismo balneare in Romagna", together with V. Balducci. Her research interests have progressively focused on the themes of urban regeneration and social innovation practices, as evidenced by the book published with Martina Massari, "Praticare l'urbanistica. Traiettorie fra innovazione sociale e pianificazione" (Franco Angeli 2023). In Cesena she teaches Elements of Town Planning and she participates in the Final Workshop Urban Design in the single-cycle Degree Course in Architecture. She is the scientific director of CARTA Lab. In Bologna she teaches Urban Policies at the Course of Service Design and she coordinates Structuring the City by Design Lab at the Master Degree in Architecture and Creative Practices for Cities and Landscape. She is responsible for the Erasmus exchanges between the Department of Architecture and the Ecole Nationale Supérieure d'Architecture et de Paysage (ENSAP) in Lille; the ENSA of Nantes; the ENSA de Normandie in Rouen; the ENSA Paris val-deSeine and the University of the West of England (UWE) in Bristol. From 2007 to 2016 she has been a member of the supervising team at the doctoral school of Architecture of the University of Bologna. ## **CURRENT PROJECTS**

1. Race law and national identity in medieval northern Europe: an economic and social history of law and ethnicity in the age of medieval colonization.

This is a pioneering comparative examination of the relationship between regional economies and legal frameworks of ethnic discrimination born of the Anglo-Norman colonization of Wales and Ireland, and the Germanic colonization of Prussia (Poland) and the Baltic coastal regions.

I have received funding from the British Academy (as above, 2017–19) and Polish National Agency for Academic Exchange (as above, 2019–21). The 2022 Oxford University Press volume, *Towns on the Edge in Medieval Europe* is the initial output, with the Manchester University Press monograph to follow in 2026.

2. Decolonisation at the end of the Middle Ages

This project seeks to analyse the processes of counter-colonisation and decolonisation in the urban networks of late medieval Wales, Ireland, Prussia and Livonia c.1350–1550, leading to the emergence of modern national identities. 'Counter-colonization' is the entry of native persons into physical, social and economic spaces originally created, and subsequently dominated, by a foreign settler community. 'Decolonisation' is the corresponding diminution of foreign social and economic dominance in the colonial, urban space.
